The following projects are currently under construction in the Springfield and Sangamon County community:



\$58 million: Capital construction investment for IL State **Fairgrounds**



\$750 million: Swift Current's Double Black Diamond Solar, largest solar project in the midwest.



\$500 million: Illinois State Capitol complex renovations

\$550 million: Illinois Department of Transportation in Sangamon County



\$15 million: **UIS Innovation Center**, scheduled to open in 2025

Proposed Major Projects



Lincoln Land Energy Project is a proposed 1,090-megawatt natural gasfired combined-cycle facility located just south of Pawnee in Sangamon County; approximately 20 miles south of Springfield. An economic impact study indicates the project will generate \$1.53 billion in economic output during construction and will create more than 1,000 direct and secondary jobs.



Scheels Sports Complex at Legacy Pointe is expected to break ground in fall 2023, with an estimated \$25M annual economic impact. The Sports Complex is a 95-acre development that would include flexible, multi-use indoor and outdoor facilities as well as space for family entertainment.





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
